Into the Light: Finding Hope Through Prayers of Lament

In this nine-lesson study, P. Lynn Miller revives lament as a proper theological response to the difficult situations of our world. One of the foundational points of the study is that, in scripture, lament usually leads to hope. After crying out to God, the one who laments remembers God. And while that doesn't fix things in the moment—the injustice, the loss still exists—the lamenter is strengthened to face the world and to hope. And for us as Christians, hope is not just an emotional response or an attitude of pie in the sky. Hope implies movement: both God's inherent movement toward justice and our movement toward God. Recovering lament may be one of the church's most timely gifts to the world."

Faith in Sharing House is operating on a limited staff with limited hours during this COVID crisis. Currently FISH is in need of canned fruit and sugar. A delivery from our church was made on Monday, July 27th. These foods and paper sacks can be left at the church and they will be delivered to FISH or any individual may drop off food at 504 Joliet Monday thru Friday between 1 and 2 pm.

Mission and Ministry of First Presbyterian Church has helped one couple this month with food and a night in a motel. They have both lost their jobs and were waiting on a check and job offers from places that they had applied. This was only a band aid to help them out. They were also given information on FISH, Plainview Disaster Relief and South Plains Community Action. This was not the first call in July asking for help, but the only one that the Church could help with. Several calls are asking for rent assistance and the church does not help with rent but refers people to agencies that can. On July 8^{th,} an email was sent out to the congregation asking for help. The Mission and Ministry Team is attempting to make a list of resources for people who call the church and for people who fill out the benevolence form.

Prayer Blankets were made this month and handed out to Kim Butler, Bill Coleman and Shelley Williams. Please say a prayer for healing for these people.


